



CAMPGROUND RULES

2026 OPERATING SEASON

Aanii, biindigen!

Hello and welcome to Point Grondine Park. This unique, Anishinaabe-owned camping and outdoor experience is located on 18000 acres of unceded territory in the beautiful area of Killarney, Ontario. PGP welcomes you to our 2026 operating season and requests all guests follow the rules of the park during your visit.

2026 Campground Updates

As of the 2026 season, we are currently operating 12 car and trailer campsites. All sites in PGP are currently non-serviced. Sites do not feature electrical hookups and there is no water available at PGP. All campers are requested to bring potable water during their stay. Showers and a trailer dump and fill station are available at nearby Killarney Provincial Park (15mins west on HWY 637) with a valid PGP permit.

Operating Rules and Regulations

1. All campers or visitors to Point Grondine Park must be registered at the Campground Office.
2. Full Payment of all fees and charges is required at the time of your reservation.
3. Campsite permit holders must be a minimum of sixteen (16) years of age or older.
4. Park check-in time is 2pm. Park check-out time is 12pm.
5. Campsites include a single vehicle access permit. Additional vehicle parking permits are available at the Gatehouse during operating hours.
6. Reservations can be completed online, via the Head office phone Monday to Friday 8-4, or at the Gatehouse during operating hours from 9-5 Monday to Sunday during campground operational dates.
7. All front-country campsites are non-serviced. No electrical or water connections are available at Point Grondine Park. Guests with a valid permit can access resources at Killarney Provincial Park.
8. Park day-use hours are 9am-10pm, with day-use permits available from the park website or at the gatehouse.
9. All vehicles within the park must display a valid permit and can provide proof of permit to Park Staff upon request. Failure to provide a permit can lead to eviction or charges.

Park Occupancy Rules

1. No more than six people can occupy a campsite unless consisting of a single family of parents and children.
2. Park visiting hours are 9am-10pm. Only registered campers are permitted to remain in the park or enter outside of visiting hours.
3. No excessive noise in the park at any time. Campers are requested to observe quiet hours starting at 10pm. Failure to respect other guests can result in eviction.
4. Generators are allowed between 10am-2pm. Please avoid using generator unnecessarily. Use of inverter-style generators is recommended.
5. Where space permits on campsites, you will be allowed up to two (2) pieces of shelter equipment on site, plus one (1) dining shelter and up to one (1) tarp. Only one piece of shelter equipment can be a larger dwelling (such as a tent trailer,

motor home, self-propelled camping unit). Guests are asked to use care when attaching tarp lines to nearby trees and guests are prohibited from using any sort of nail or hardware attachment to trees.

6. Point Grondine currently has three vault privies, two in the campground and one by the waterfront. Guests are reminded to not dump trash, food scraps or waste items of any kind down the vault privy.
7. Other than when prohibited by park management, alcohol beverages may only be possessed and consumed on campsites registered and occupied by park guests. Alcohol is not permitted on trails or the park waterfront. Possession and consumption by any person must be in compliance with the Ontario Liquor Licencing and Control Act 2019 (LLCA).
8. Smoking tobacco (cigarettes, cigars) and use of Electronic Cigarettes (vaping) is permitted only on campsites registered and occupied by park guests. Smoking is prohibited on trails and the park waterfront. Smokers are asked to dispose of all cigarette butts and not to discard them in park fire pits.
9. Cannabis use is permitted only on campsites registered and occupied by park guests. Possession and consumption by any person must be in compliance with the Cannabis Control Act 2017 (CCA).
10. Campsites shall be maintained at all times to a clean condition considered satisfactory by Park Management. Campers who violate this policy may face eviction and additional charges.
11. All campers and park visitors are responsible for garbage and recyclables. Point Grondine currently has a limited capacity for garbage, and all guests will be given a single garbage tag on check-in. Garbage and recyclables must be separated into a single bag each and can be dropped at the garbage pick-up between 12-2 daily. Guests are asked to not place garbage at the pick-up during any other time to avoid attracting nuisance wildlife. Recyclables are expected to be rinsed and sorted if possible. Any excess garbage must be taken with the camper.
12. There is to be NO burning of garbage at any time within the park.
13. Always remember to be bear aware and store food locked in a secure area, such as your vehicle.
14. Point Grondine Park strongly encourages the principle of Leave No Trace camping. Take nothing but photographs, leave nothing but footprints.
15. There is to be absolutely no dumping of waste anywhere on Point Grondine Park.
16. Pets are welcomed in Point Grondine Park, but all pets must be kept in physical control at all times. Dogs are not permitted off-leash at Point Grondine Park,

and must be on a leash no greater than two (2) metres in length. No pets are permitted at the waterfront. Pet owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets. Pets are not permitted to act aggressively towards other guests, and must follow the noise rules of the park. Guests in violation may be evicted.

17. Campfires are permitted in designated fire pit areas only and firepits may not be moved. No one is allowed to start or maintain a fire except in a designated fire pit area. All fires must be thoroughly extinguished before departure. Any out-of-control fires must be reported to Guardians or staff as soon as possible. If Guardians are not available, please call 911.
18. Campground guests are not permitted to gather firewood from anywhere in Park lands. Campfire wood is available at the Gatehouse. NO outside firewood is permitted. Campers observed gathering deadfall will be asked to stop. Further action will result in eviction.
19. Guests at Point Grondine Park are prohibited from removing anything natural from the park. Guests are reminded to not pick flowers or remove plants or trees or remove any natural souvenirs from the park.
20. Point Grondine Park is a natural wilderness area. Guests are reminded that wildlife is common and can be dangerous. Please avoid engaging with wildlife. Point Grondine assumes no liability for camper actions that may lead to injury following a wildlife encounter.
21. No person at any time shall remove, damage or deface Park property, or deface any relic, artifact or natural object in the park. Guests observed or reported doing so will be evicted from the park and charges may be laid by police.
22. The maximum road speed in the park is 20km/h. Guests are reminded to follow the Highway Traffic Act and ensure all passengers are seated and secured by a seatbelt. Passengers are not permitted to ride in the bed of trucks.
23. No person entering Point Grondine Park shall operate an All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV), dirt bikes or any/all other off-road vehicle anywhere within Point Grondine without the permission of Park Management.
24. No motorized boats are permitted to be used by Park guests. No public boat launch is available on Mahzenazing Lake.
25. Park guests are requested to avoid damaging vegetation by staying to designated campsites and trail areas. Do not disturb natural vegetation or disturb/harass wildlife.
26. Drones are not permitted in Point Grondine Park without the permission of Park Management.

Backcountry

- 1. Point Grondine Park features several backcountry options, including the two-day Wemtagoosh Hiking Trail, the Kaa-Gaa-Genhs water trail, the Tri-Lakes Canoe Route and coastal sites along Georgian Bay. Guests staying in the backcountry are under the same rules as all park guests with the following changes.**
- 2. Backcountry campers are required to park in one of the designated areas. Permits must be displayed. Permits must be presented to Guardians upon request.**
- 3. The hiking trails and portage trails are use at your own risk. Point Grondine Park makes all attempts to ensure that trails and portages are maintained and navigable.**
- 4. Backcountry campers must camp within a designated site in Point Grondine Park boundaries. Coastal campers may, where necessary, camp on the coast of Point Grondine Park should the need arise.**
- 5. Campers are required to use existing campsite facilities such as fire pits and thunderboxes and are not permitted to create permanent bushcraft furniture or buildings. Campers are required to maintain site standards and follow practices of Leave No Trace.**
- 6. Campers are requested to travel distance beyond the campsite boundaries when looking for firewood. Campers are not permitted to cut live trees or damage anything within a radius of the campsite. Where possible, dead wood brought in from other areas should be used.**
- 7. Campers must ensure that all campfires are fully extinguished before exiting their site for the day.**
- 8. Backcountry campers are reminded to keep themselves bear aware. Scented items and food items should be kept away from the campsite, either hung from**

a tree 10m off the ground, or sealed away in bear-resistant containers. Point Grondine Park is not responsible for any damages occurred from wildlife.

9. Cans and bottles are not permitted within Point Grondine Park backcountry.
10. Campers are reminded to ensure their drinking water is safe by boiling, chemical or mechanical treatment methods.
11. Pack out all garbage. Keep sites clean. Pack out more than you pack in.
12. Backcountry campsites have a check-in time of 2pm and a check-out time of 12pm.

Group Camping

1. Point Grondine Park currently has several backcountry premium group sites, and one in the campground.
2. Group Camping maximum occupancy is 16 persons on a backcountry site, and 40 in Group campground.
3. Group Camping includes one parking permit. Additional parking permits are available at the gatehouse.
4. Group Camping is under the same rules as the remainder of the park. Guests are reminded to keep noise levels low, respect the natural environment and maintain site cleanliness.

Point Grondine Park reserves the right to enforce park rules and restrictions within the territory.

Guests must follow the instructions of Park Guardians and Management Staff during their time within Point Grondine Park.

Non-compliance with park rules may result in eviction and/or charges and penalties.
